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<sup>1</sup> In the recent years I have preferred to send my articles to books and proceedings of congresses and conferences rather than to journals. The reason is technical: in my articles on Semitic etymology and phonology I have to use many Oriental scripts (not only Hebrew and Arabic, but also Ethiopian, Syriac, Coptic, Hebrew with Babylonian vocalization, etc.), as well as systems of highly complicated transcription and transliteration. All this can be reproduced in camera-ready form or from my computer diskets, which is acceptable in books and conference proceedings, but not in journals (with their traditional method of printing). Therefore most of my recent papers are printed not in journals, but rather as articles in books and in proceedings of congresses and conferences.

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## **I. INFORMATION ON SCIENTIFIC ACTIVITY AND RESEARCH PLANS**

A. Dolgopolsky is going on studying history and prehistory of Hebrew and Semitic (historical phonology, morphology, etymology), as well as deep etymology, i.e. genetic connections of Semitic with the other Hamito-Semitic languages (with special emphasis on Cushitic) and with distantly related languages. The results of this research will be summarized in three main publications:

- (1) an etymological dictionary of Indo-European roots of Nostratic origin
- (2) an etymological dictionary of Uralic roots of Nostratic origin.
- (3) a Nostratic grammar.
